



Henrico Shuts Out Deep Run

Richmond, VA - Henrico picked up 417 yards of total offense while holding Deep Run to just 52 as the Warriors (3-0) defeated the Wildcats (0-3), 41-0. The shutout marked the third straight game that Henrico has shut out an opponent.

After an exchange of punts early, the Warriors drew first blood on a 12-play, 70 yard drive that saw the Warriors pick up 5 first downs before Andre Taylor scored on a 1-yard touchdown run.

Henrico forced another Deep Run punt which resulted in a 6-play, 55 yard drive capped by Xavier Goodall's 13-yard rushing score. The Warriors would score on their next possession as well, with Goodall scoring his second rushing touchdown of the game- this time from 3 yards out for a 21-0 lead.

The Warriors blocked a punt after forcing a three-and-out, giving the offense excellent field position. However, Kobe Chavis lost a fumble at the 15, giving the Wildcats some momentum. After an exchange of punts, Deep Run finally got the ball rolling.

Aaron Wright moved the Wildcats into Henrico territory, advancing as far as the 40 before DeShawn Robinson intercepted a badly thrown pass at the 15 to snuff out the scoring chance.

Henrico scored on its first two possessions of the second half, with Xavier Goodall catching an 18-yard TD pass from Andre Taylor and Kobe Chavis rushing for a 69-yard touchdown run.

AJ Martin scored the Warriors' sixth touchdown of the game in the fourth quarter to finish off the game.

Aaron Wright led Deep Run, completing 8 of 19 passes for 40 yards and one interception. Aaron Tuck led the Wildcats defensively with 6 tackles.

Kobe Chavis led Henrico with 108 yards rushing and a touchdown. Andre Taylor completed 3 of 4 passes for 55 yards and a touchdown. Defensively, Kadofi Wright led the Warriors with 7 tackles, 2 tackles for loss, and 1 sack.

Henrico will next play Atlee on September 26 after a bye week.
